

Stress Management Workshops

The Prevention team from both the BZA office and Thunder Bay office hosted several sessions on stress management.

Facilitators presented common causes, symptoms, and behavior related to stress. The impacts of adverse childhood experiences(ACE) were explained giving understanding on how stress can affect your health, mental health, and addictions. Tips on selfcare, and activities were provided to help keep stress down, which affects your body.



Participants provided good feedback on their understanding of stress on health and addictions. They also stated that the information and tools provided were useful and productive. They all received a gift bag with a journal, stress ball and fidget toy (stress reliever).
